CITY OF NEIGHBORHOODS

Philadelphia's neighborhoods each have their own distinct flavor. Here are a few to check out:

CHINATOWN Located in Center City, Chinatown is home to restaurants and stores representing Hong Kong, Cantonese, Fujianese, Northern Sichuan and Taiwanese cultures, with a sprinkling of Korean, Thai, Malaysian, Burmese, and Vietnamese.

AFRICATOWN One of the fastest growing Black communities in the U.S., Africatown, located in Southwest Philadelphia, is deeply connected to Africa's heritage.

EL CENTRO DE ORO A hub of Latinx culture translating to "the Golden Block," this section north of Temple of University is home to family-owned shops, restaurants, community centers and arts spaces.

WEST PHILADELPHIA/UNIVERSITY CITY Home to University of Pennsylvania and Drexel University, West Philadelphia is a vibrant, diverse neighborhood with rich culture and a strong sense of community.

SOUTH PHILADELPHIA In this neighborhood, Vietnamese immigrants recently established grocery stores, restaurants, and karaoke bars, joining well-established Italian and Mexican businesses and residents.

SUBURBS Many area colleges and universities are situated in quaint suburban towns, all within commuting distance of the city by car or public transportation.


THRIVE PHILLY
